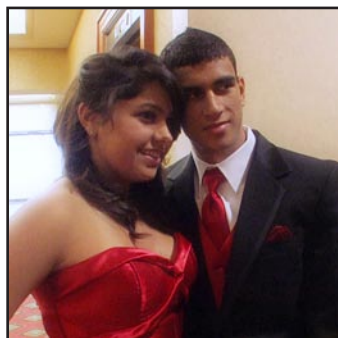

AN UNLIKELY FRIENDSHIP
